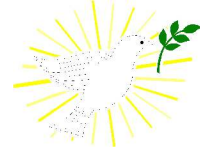

G25. agapao, *ag-ap-ah'-o*; perh. from agan (much) [or comp. H5689]; to love (in a social or moral sense):--(be-) love (-ed). Comp. G5368.

G26. agape, *ag-ah'-pay*; from G25; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; spec. (plur.) a love-feast:--(feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

Phileo

5368. *phileo*, *fil-eh'-o*; from G5384; to be a friend to (fond of [an individual or an object]), i.e. have affection for (denoting personal attachment, as a matter of sentiment or feeling; while G25 is wider, embracing espec. the judgment and the deliberate assent of the will as a matter of principle, duty and propriety: the two thus stand related very much as G2309 and G1014, or as G2372 and G3563 respectively; the former being chiefly of the heart and the latter of the head); spec. to kiss (as a mark of tenderness):--kiss, love.

Theleo

G2309. *thelo*, *thel'-o*; or *ethelo*, *eth-el'-o*; in certain tenses *theleo*, *thel-eh'-o*; and *etheleo*, *eth-el-eh'-o*, which are otherwise obsol.; appar. strengthened from the alt. form of G138; to determine (as an act. option from subj. impulse; whereas G1014 prop. denotes rather a pass. acquiescence in obj. considerations), i.e. choose or prefer (lit. or fig.); by impl. to wish, i.e. be inclined to (sometimes adv. gladly); impers. for the fut. tense, to be about to; by Heb. to delight in:--desire, be disposed (forward), intend, list, love, mean, please, have rather, (be) will (have, -ling, -ling [ly]).

5360. philadelphia, fil-ad-el-fee'ah; from G5361; fraternal affection:--brotherly love (kindness), love of the brethren.

Philarguria

5365. philarguria, fil-ar-goo-ree'ah; from G5366; avarice:--love of money.

Philandros

5362. philandros, fil'an-dros; from G5384 and G435; fond of man, i.e. affectionate as a wife:--love their husbands.

Titus 2:4

Philoteknos

5388. philoteknos, fil-ot'-ek-nos; from G5384 and G5043; fond of one's children, i.e. maternal:--love their children.

Titus 2:4

Philanthropia

5363. philanthropia, fil-an-thro-pee'-ah; from the same as G5364; fondness of mankind, i.e. benevolence ("philanthropy"):--kindness, love towards man.

Titus 3:4

Philadelphos

5361. philadelphos, fil-ad'-el-fos; from G5384 and G80; fond of brethren, i.e. fraternal:--love as brethren.

1 Peter 3:8

Philautos

5367. philautos, fil'-ow-tos; from G5384 and G846; fond of self, i.e. selfish:--lover of own self.

2 Timothy 3:2

Philedonos

5369. philedonos, fil-ay'-don-os; from G5384 and G2237; fond of pleasure, i.e. voluptuous:--lover of pleasure.

2 Timothy 3:4

Philoxenos

5382. philoxenos, fil-ox'-en-os; from G5384 and G3581; fond of guests, i.e. hospitable:--given to (lover of, use) hospitality.

Titus 1:8

Philoproteuo

5383. philoproteuo, fil-op-rote-yoo'-o; from a comp. of G5384 and G4413; to be fond of being first, i.e. ambitious of distinction:--love to have the preeminence.
